Spring and Autumn are the migrating seasons, when birds go north to their breeding grounds and south to their winter homes. Migration routes usually follow rivers or the coast, and consequently India is a good place for watching migrating birds. The first signs of the spring migration come in mid-March, and during April and May it is in full swing. A good deal is known about the migrating habits of swallows. These birds cover great distances. Birds that have been ringed in Southern England, for example, have been recovered in South Africa. In East Asia, large number of swallows, spend the winter in Malaysia, and birds ringed there have been recovered in South Korea during the breeding season. Swallows also breed in India and nests can often be seen above the door of houses throughout South-West India. These swallows do not usually migrate and they breed from March to May and raise their families in nests made of mud. Swallows migrate by day. The swallow is responsible for the most surprising ringing recovery so far recorded in the Far East. A bird ringed in Pahang, Malaysia, in January 1967 was retrapped at the same place in February 1968.


