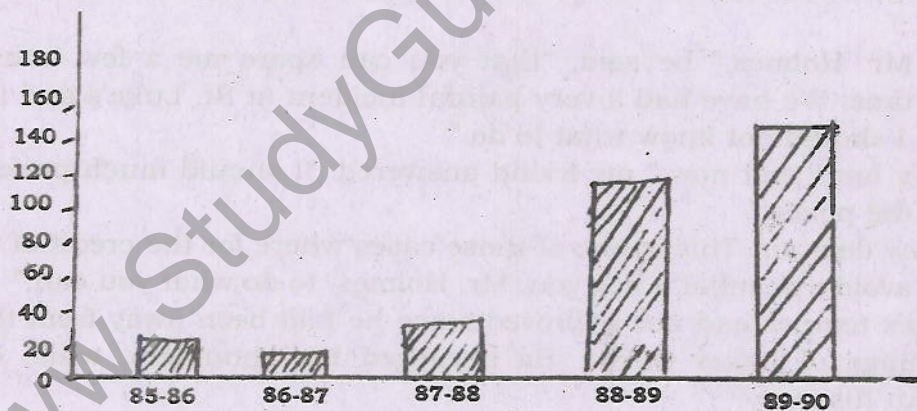
- IV. Write a précis of the following passage reducing it to one-third of its length : 10

Trees are useful to man in three ways; they provide him with wood and other products; they give him shade; and they help to prevent drought and flood. Unfortunately in many parts of world, man has not realised that the third of these services is the most important. In this eagerness to draw in large numbers only to find that with them he has lost the best friends he had. Even when a government realises the importance of a plentiful supply of trees, it is difficult for it to persuade the villagers to see this.

The villagers want wood to cook their food with; and can earn money by making charcoal or selling wood to the townsman. They are usually too lazy or careless to plant and look after new trees. So, unless the government has a good system of control, or can educate the people the forests will slowly disappear. This does not mean the villager's sons and grandsons have fewer trees. The results are even more serious; for where there are trees their roots break the soil allowing the rain to sink in and also bind the soil thus preventing its being washed away easily, but where there are no trees, the rain falls on hard ground and carrying away with it, the rich top-soil is gone, nothing remains but worthless desert.
